Effective June 13, 2019, Chapter 35 of the Laws of 2019 repealed non-medical exemptions from vaccination for children attending school.

This document is in follow-up to FAQs issued on June 18, 2019.

The 2019-20 School Year New York State Immunization Requirements for School Entrance/Attendance is available online.

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) catch-up immunization schedule is available online.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO ALL STUDENTS

Public Health Law §2164, as amended by Chapter 35 of the Laws of 2019 applies to students attending all schools as defined in Public Health Law §2164 to include any public, private or parochial child caring center, day nursery, day care agency, nursery school, kindergarten, elementary, intermediate or secondary schools.

Public Health Law §2164, as amended by Chapter 35 of the Laws of 2019 prohibits a school from permitting any child to be admitted to such school, or to attend such school, in excess of 14 days without sufficient evidence that the child has received all age appropriate required vaccinations. The 14 days may be extended where the student is transferring from out of state or from another country and can show a good faith effort to get the necessary evidence or where the parent, guardian or any other person in parental relationship can demonstrate that a child has received the first age-appropriate dose in each immunization series and that they have age appropriate scheduled appointments for follow-up doses to complete the immunization series in accordance with the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices Recommended Immunization Schedules for Persons Aged 0 through 18.

1. Does the new law apply to children's camps issued a permit by the State or local health department?

No. The new legislation applies to schools as defined in Public Health Law §2164 and does not apply to children's camps that are issued a permit by the State or local health department.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING CHANGE IN IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDANCE IN SCHOOL

Pursuant to Public Health Law 2164

Students who have not received required vaccinations are no longer allowed to attend school. These students may return to school when they have complied with the immunization requirements.

With regard to Students already enrolled and attending School:

The **DEADLINE** for obtaining required vaccinations for children attending school in the fall is **14 days from the first day of school.**

Students who do not meet the immunization requirements are to be excluded on the 15th day they fail to meet them.

This may **ONLY** be extended to 30 days for students transferring from another state or country. Students who meet the requirements of "IN PROCESS" (obtaining missing doses in accordance with Department of Health Regulations) may attend school as long as they remain in compliance.

Parents also have the option to complete the paperwork and enroll the students in an approved home-schooling program.

(A new exit code 430 will be implemented in order to allow districts to exit these students from enrollment.)

Pursuant to Public Health Law 2164, students who have not received required vaccinations are no longer allowed to attend school. These students may return to school when they have complied with the immunization requirements. Parents also have the option to complete the paperwork and enroll the students in an approved home-schooling program.

The ~~deadline for obtaining Required~~ ^{already} vaccinations for children attending school in the fall is 14 days from the first day of school, which may be extended to 30 days for students transferring from another state or country. ~~Additionally,~~ students who meet the requirements of *in process* (obtaining missing doses in accordance with Department of Health Regulations) may attend school as long as they remain in compliance. Students who do not meet the immunization requirements are to be excluded on the 15th day they fail to meet them. A new exit code 430 will be implemented in order to allow districts to exit these students from enrollment.

Districts will not be accountable for students once they properly exit, with the exception of graduation rate for accountability and total cohort graduation rate. Guidance from the U.S. Dept of Education (ED) indicated that the rules in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) for excluding students from graduation cohorts are very specific and do not include this condition. Therefore, exiting a student with the new 430 exit code will NOT remove the student from graduation rate cohorts for accountability or the total cohort graduation rate release.

For graduation rate accountability, students must be reported with a local or Regents diploma to be considered graduates. For the total cohort graduation rate release, these students will be counted as dropouts. Specifically, under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) sections 8101(23)(B) and (25)(B), a school or Local Education Agency (LEA) may only remove a student from a cohort if the student transfers to a school where he/she is expected to receive a regular high school diploma or eligible State-defined alternate diploma, emigrates to another country, transfers to a prison or juvenile facility, or is deceased.
